

ABOUT BAYVIEW & DOGPATCH

The Bayview and Dogpatch neighborhoods are connected by over 100 years of shared history - home first to heavy industries such as shipbuilding, locomotive manufacturing, slaughterhouses, food production and power and water plants that formed the backbone of San Francisco's infrastructure - they are now vibrant, mixed use neighborhoods with thriving public spaces. These sunny southeast side siblings have rapidly been catching on as hidden gems since the T-train light rail line opened along the main Third Street transportation and commercial corridor in 2007.

Dogpatch has experienced a breathtaking transformation in the last decade, since it's industrial landscape has embraced cutting-edge makers, designers, bakers, chefs and more. From hand-crafted ice-cream, wine bars and fine-dining to locally-made products and curated retail experiences, Dogpatch is without a doubt a destination neighborhood.

Just to the south, Bayview is an ethnically diverse neighborhood home to the highest percentage of multi-generational homes in San Francisco. Many were built during the WWII Navy Shipyard boom that attracted thousands of black families from the south. Today, Bayview is still home to the largest black community in San Francisco, with a vibrant mix of family-owned coffee houses, legacy businesses, art studios, soul food, up-and-coming micro-breweries and decorative gardens tended by community residents - plus incredible views and the warmest, sunniest weather in the city.





