



Sunday Streets 2021 Program Guidelines

Wet Weather/Natural Disaster Policy

About

Sunday Streets is a program of the nonprofit Livable City, presented in partnership with SFMTA, SFDPH, and the City and County of San Francisco. Sunday Streets mission is to:

- Create temporary open space and recreational opportunities in neighborhoods most lacking
- Encourage active living and healthy eating
- Foster community building
- Inspire people to think differently about their streets as public spaces

The Sunday Streets Program Guidelines are created to maintain public safety and the integrity of the program's mission. We thank you in advance for investing in San Francisco by participating at Sunday Streets and adhering to all of the Sunday Streets Program Guidelines.

Force Majeure

In the event of a cancellation due to Force Majeure, it is agreed that Livable City will not be held responsible for the cancellation. Force Majeure includes but is not limited to Acts of Nature such as heavy rain, flooding, unstable ground, earthquakes, unhealthy air quality or storms of any kind or the negligence or decisions made by the City and County of San Francisco permitting agencies to alter or cancel a Sunday Streets event.

Wet Weather Protocol

Sunday Streets is a sprinkle or shine event, meaning wet weather cancellations only occur when it is certain there will be a heavy, constant downpour that continues past 12 PM on the day of the event. In the event of a wet weather contingency plan or cancellation going into effect, Sunday Streets will notify all exhibitors by 12 PM the day before the event. Sunday Streets asks that questions regarding wet weather contingency plans and cancellation be held to a minimum before 12 PM the day before the event.

If no announcement is made, it is assumed the event will go forward as planned and exhibitors are expected to arrive on time.

Please note: Due to the uncertainty of weather predictions, we rarely cancel before 12 PM on the day of the event. However, we will begin to implement wet weather contingency plans if the prediction for rain during the hours of the event exceeds 80% by 10 AM.

Poor Air Quality Protocol

We will cancel an event if the air-quality index (AQI) exceeds 150 by 12pm the day before the event with a similar prediction for the following day.

As we brace for more days with poor air quality in the Bay Area due to climate change and wildfires, Livable City and the City and County of San Francisco are working on protocols for rescheduling events and will provide information when it becomes available.
