



## Sunday Streets 2021 COVID-19 Safety Guidelines

### About

Sunday Streets is a program of the nonprofit Livable City, presented in partnership with SFMTA, SFDPH, and the City and County of San Francisco. Sunday Streets mission is to:

- Create temporary open space and recreational opportunities in neighborhoods most lacking
- Encourage active living and healthy eating
- Foster community building
- Inspire people to think differently about their streets as public spaces

The Sunday Streets Program Guidelines are created to maintain public safety and the integrity of the program's mission. We thank you in advance for investing in San Francisco by participating in Sunday Streets and adhering to all of the Sunday Streets Program Guidelines.

San Francisco's Department of Public Health (SFDPH) monitors citywide COVID-19 infections and regularly updates public health directives. On August 2, 2021, SFDPH revised the current Order<sup>3</sup> to require indoor masking in light of the increase in cases and hospitalizations due to the highly contagious Delta variant. Livable City will follow those guidance and update all partners, exhibitors, and participants as needed.

Per CDC and SFDPH recommendations, the following COVID-19 protocols will be in place for all Sunday Streets Rise Together and Phoenix Day events:

- **Face coverings are required in indoor public settings for everyone, regardless of their vaccination status**
  - Except for those who have specified medical disabilities and are able to present documentation, children under two of age, or if they are actively eating, drinking, performing, or participating in sports
- **Unvaccinated or partially vaccinated<sup>4</sup> people are always required to wear face coverings**
- Fully vaccinated individuals are still encouraged to wear face coverings in outdoor crowded spaces, or when a six-foot distance cannot be maintained between different households, because one can still catch and transmit the virus, even if they are vaccinated
- All Livable City staff and volunteers are advised to cancel their attendance if they experience any of the common symptoms of COVID-19 infection and call their medical provider immediately. These symptoms include:
  - Fever or chills
  - Cough or sore throat
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - Fatigue or body aches

- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Exhibitors are advised to share this advisory, along with other relevant guidelines, with their onsite staff scheduled for Sunday Streets and required to notify Livable City any cancellation due to sickness no later than 8:00 am on the event day to coordinate equipment needs
- All Livable City staff, partners, and exhibitors are required to complete the [Personnel & Partner COVID-19 Screening form](#) to help with the contact tracing efforts
- Exhibitors should bring hand sanitizers and disinfectant wipes or solutions for their staff and booth visitors. Hand sanitizer and disposable masks are provided at the information booth
- COVID-19 signage, including information on current best practices and vaccination, will be placed at entries to the event and at activity stations
