



Sunday Streets SF 2024 Amplified Sound Policy

ABOUT

Sunday Streets is a program of the nonprofit Livable City, presented in partnership with SFMTA, SFDPH, and the City and County of San Francisco. Sunday Streets' mission is to:

- Create temporary open spaces and recreational opportunities where it's needed most
- Encourage healthy eating and active living
- Foster community-building
- Inspire people to think about their streets as public spaces

This policy is part of Sunday Streets SF Program Guidelines, created to maintain public safety and the integrity of the program's mission. We thank you in advance for investing in San Francisco by participating in Sunday Streets SF and observing this policy and all other policies outlined in Sunday Streets Program Guidelines.

The SF Entertainment Commission and neighborhood Police Station approve permits for the placement and sound limits of music on Sunday Streets in advance of each event. Thank you for adhering to the guidelines below so we can maintain a respectful and fun environment for all and stay in compliance with the permits issued.

PERFORMER REQUIREMENTS

- Complete the online Sound Agreement at least 5 business days prior to the event
- Only generate sound during the hours of the event (11:00am-4:00pm)
- Follow all placement and sound adjustment requests from Sunday Streets staff
- No consumption of alcohol onsite or inappropriate behavior due to intoxication allowed

EQUIPMENT GUIDELINES

- Amplification system **not** to exceed 700 watt output
- Generators not to exceed 5 gallons, must obtain written approval from Sunday Streets prior to the event. Generator approvals are first come, first serve and are not guaranteed
- Stages are prohibited <u>unless you receive written approval from Sunday Streets prior to the event</u>

PLACEMENT, SETUP, BREAKDOWN

Load-In/Out: Vehicles are **not** allowed on the route between 10:00am-4:00pm. If driving, please arrange for equipment drop-off and pickup to occur before or after.

Placement: Use only your assigned location on the route. Any amplified activity outside of these areas will be shut down.

Breakdown: Performers must have all equipment broken down and either on the sidewalk or parking lane by 3:45 p.m.
